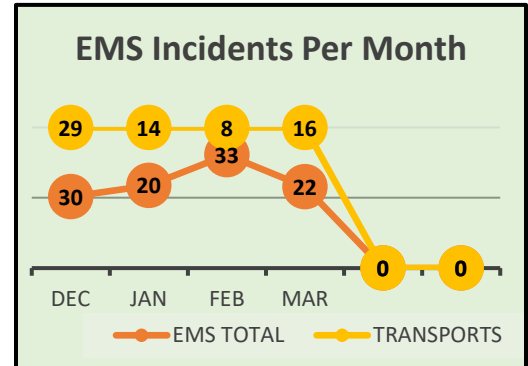
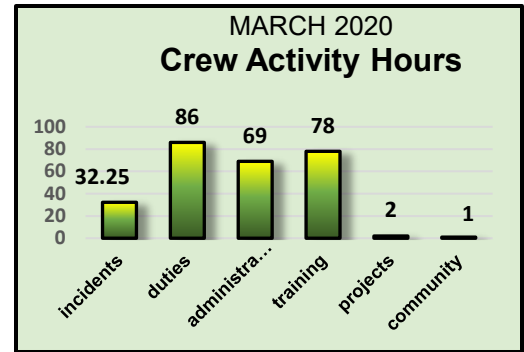

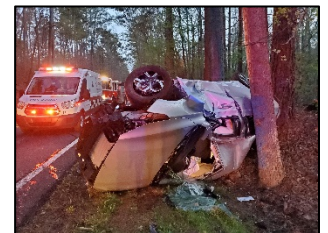


Department Operations & Response

- Fire/EMS personnel have modified station access, operations and response to safely support everyone during the current COVID-19 pandemic. Station 51 is CLOSED to non-employees, but 24/7 staffing is maintained. We are just a 911 call away at all times.

All (preventable) accidents, whether a stumped toe or car wreck, can have profound influence on first responder and ambulances services at this critical time.
